BOII in Lower Austria, cap. Vindobona (Vienna).

1. Alexander III Imitation. Athena Nike. c.4th/3rd cent. BC. AV plated stater. 18mm. 4.93g. Helmeted head of Athena r./ Nike standing l, holding wreath and sceptre, AΛΕΣΑΝΔΠΟΨ. Contemporary forgery of Le Rider pl.91/92, Sear GCV (1975) 6702. LT—; cf. Paulsen (1933) pl.1, nos.1-2; Castelin 1206-08; Dembski 474; Flesche 749-750. Gd VF for issue, most of plating intact, bold head, nice Nike, full inscription. First we've had. Ex Y Schyler coll.

A neat copy of the Greek original, well struck on a large flan, but Alexander's name is quite clumsily engraved. The first time we've had a gold plated imitation of this type. Our attribution to the Boii is tentative.
